HHI22 Spring 2013 Final Examination Study Guide

The final examination for this course will take place on May 9, 2013 from 8:40-10:40 A.M. (Rm. Pratt 520). The test is slated for two hours even though students may leave if they finish early. It will be a closed-book, no notes, no electronic devices examination. Students will be allowed to bring drinks or snacks to the test but only if they do not interfere with their or their fellow students' tests. All answers will be written in a blue book. You may write anything you want on the test sheet, but remember that you have to hand it back along with your test.

Format:

The final examination will consist of two sections:

- I) Texts in context (90 minutes)
- II) Essay Question (30 minutes)

Section I: Texts in context

This section will be divided into sections A and B. In each of them, there will be five passages taken from diverse texts assigned this semester. The students are to choose **three** from each section (for a total of six) and identity the author, title and significance of this text. Any student who chooses more than three texts from either section A or B will automatically receive an "F" for not following instructions.

The texts that the professor will use for creating the test are:

- 1) Olaudah Equiano, Life of Gustavus Vassa (Sources II)
- 2) Lincoln, *Gettysburg Address* (Anthology)
- 3) Lenin "What is to be Done?" (Anthology)
- 4) Hitler, Mein Kempf (Sources II)
- 5) Borowski, *The People Who Walked On* (Anthology)
- 6) Maus I-II
- 7) Gandhi *Hind Swaraj* or Indian Home Rule (*Sources II*)
- 8) Universal Declaration of Human Rights (*Sources II*)
- 9) Martin Luther King, Jr., Letter from Birminghan City Jail (Sources II)
- 10) Nkrumah, *Continental Government for Africa* (Anthology)

Section II: Essay question

Students are to choose **one** question from those listed on the test and answer it in essay format.
